What is the role of a Governor?

Governors are a group of volunteers who include parents, staff and members of our local community. Our main role is to promote ongoing improvements in standards throughout the school under the REACH 2 Multi Academy Trust for the West Midlands. We help the headteacher and staff plan the school's long term direction and we evaluate progress. We help to set the school's aims and values and are responsible for some staff appointments, including in cooperation the REACH 2 Board, the headteacher. Many of our responsibilities carry a statutory requirement. This means we are obliged by law to do such things as agree the annual budget.

Our role is sometimes described as a 'critical friend'. This does not mean we are there to criticise the school but instead to ask challenging questions to gain a greater understanding of the school and to foster an ethos of continuous improvement.

What have we done?

Since the School joined the Multi Academy Trust we have recruited a new team of governors and, within the team, appointed the key link roles of finance, safeguarding and attainment. We have met each term and reviewed the excellent standards and achievement data for the children, attending the pupil progress meetings with the staff. We have monitored the spending against the budget and approved the budget for next year.

We have fully supported the expansion of the school numbers and are working with ways to expand accommodation next year.

We have also monitored Behaviour and Safeguarding and are very pleased to see the high standards of the children in the classroom and the corridors. And we really appreciate the hard work the staff have put in bringing the learning adventures with The Lion, The Witch & The Wardrobe last term and now Harry Potter this term.
